- 4. To reflect on how they can improve their personal development as a musician
- 5. To not play music or talk over other members or session leaders whilst they are talking

- 8. To suggest ways to improve the session for the benefit of the group as a whole
- 9. To ask the session leader if any instructions are not clear

Reading Rock Academy - Band Experience Sessions

What do we expect musicians to achieve during each session?

We provide a band coach to facilitate each band experience session. We look for the progress as a band AND as an individual in the following areas:

1. Technical & Musicianship

Each member of the band must be able to demonstrate progress in their technical ability and level of musicianship for their chosen instrument.

The band coach will recommend areas for improvement and development for individual practise and in some cases may recommend instrumental or theory lessons if technical skills were needed.

2. Performance

Each member of the band must be able to demonstrate progress on their performance of their songs. Performance skills are a key part of any modern professional musician's career.

During each band session, the band coach will ensure that there are opportunities for developing performance skills both as a band and as an individual.

We also provide optional opportunities for bands to perform in a safe and friendly atmosphere on our regular performance evenings.

3. Creativity

Each member of the band must be able to demonstrate progress on their individual creativity within their area of the band. Creativity is a really important aspect of any professional musician and this can be nurtured during each band session with our experienced band coaches.

We like to see musicians try out new ideas for songs, new arrangements and innovative ways to develop the music and performance.

4.Appearance & Professionalism

Each musician must be smartly and appropriately dressed for each band experience session. During performance sessions we would expect musicians to give consideration to how the look and style themselves as a band.

We like to see musicians discussing their appearance and give consideration to how they can build their professional look as they develop as a band. The conduct of musicians during each session and performance is key to developing employable skills required in the professional music and creative industry.
